My musical choice for the Newsletter this week is the Overture to Leonard Bernstein's operetta 'Candide'. If I possessed a time machine, one of the things I'd love to do is travel back to the 1940s, 50s and 60s when the great American musicals were being produced on Broadway and the silver screen. Being a musical director in the pit for these iconic shows must have been tremendous fun, and I love both the escapism and optimism that these productions allow. Of course, Bernstein's 'Candide' (based on the original story by Voltaire) presents somewhat more serious material than is the case in many musicals, but you wouldn't know if from the joie de vivre of the overture. Bernstein was best known as a conductor, but it is as a composer that he really wished to be recognised. His creative genius is on full display in this piece. It brims with energy and uses the orchestra in a very colourful way. It is also great fun to see Bernstein himself conducting the piece, dancing away on the podium as he loved to do - he used to tell conducting students that you should use every part of your body to 'show' the music, and he does this in spades.
