Invincibly*

Here we can visualise the quiet triumph of the Heavenly Host, but also for poor, afraid, blind Mr Milton we read the epitaph of the New Model Army and the Commonwealth; the Paradise lost. Things are never what they appear to be, and triumphs and disasters are but the two sides of the same coin.

This year will look very different, with a socially distanced congregation and without the usual food donations at the altar. But we are looking forward to celebrating Harvest Festival this year. And are especially thankful that we will have music from the Choir of the Chapels Royal Tower of London, with a choir of four this Sunday, back in the Chapel again for the first time since March.



An Update from First Love Foundation, Tower Hamlets Foodbank

From 16th March – 5th July, we saw a 900% increase in referrals. This equated to providing over 30 tonnes of emergency food and toiletries to the homes of 3,726 vulnerable adults and children in Tower Hamlets and totalling over 1,826 hours of advice and support given over the phone. We provided food support throughout lockdown and increase this supply from 5 to 7 days.

We are proud to say we have been able to meet every single need of all the people that have been referred to our service. We believe it is essential – especially in the midst of this crisis to meet the need for food, but also meet the emotional, financial, and further advisory needs of the people of Tower Hamlets. Our effective, holistic approach to solving crisis will continue to be at the focal point of everything we do.

Book Review - 'Excellent Women', by Barbara Pym

I am grateful to Laura Fransella for her recommendation.

'Excellent Women', by Barbara Pym, first published in 1952, is a warm and humorous novel set in a post-war world of genteel London poverty. The wonderfully self-deprecating narrator, Mildred Lathbury, an unmarried clergyman's daughter in her 30s, becomes involved in the rather stormy lives of her new neighbours, an anthropologist called Helena and her extremely dashing naval husband. Meanwhile, in a sub-plot, the vicar of Mildred's church in Pimlico, who lives with his sister, is courting a glamorous widow, Allegra Gray. Mildred is sharply witty in her precise descriptions of the comic characters, whom she brings totally to life. This gentle and enjoyable book will make you smile on each page. (During our recent holiday in France, I observed a man having lunch at the next table, reading 'Excellent Women' in French - and doing just that!)
