Dear friends,

Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

We are now in the Easter season, which is the fifty days between Easter and Pentecost. Just as throughout Lent we said the Ash Wednesday collect every day, so we now make the acclamation **Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!** every day in this Easter season. Imagine waking up in the morning saying 'Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia! before doing anything else?

The events currently unfolding in the Middle East give us all great cause for concern. Christians throughout the Middle East, whether in small communities or in larger ones in places like Israel, are asking us to keep them in our prayers. One place where Christians have lived and worked for many years is the Al-Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza, which was founded by the Church Mission Society of the Church of England in 1882, making it one of the oldest hospitals there. Management of the hospital has changed hands between different churches in its long history. For three decades from the 1950s, it was managed by the Medical Mission of the Southern Baptist Church, when it was known as the Baptist Hospital (Mamdani in Arabic). The hospital is still commonly known as the Mamdani Hospital, or the Al-Ahli Baptist Hospital. The church has been run since the 1980s by the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, who on its website describe the hospital as a sanctuary in Gaza.

In October 2023, the hospital took a direct hit, leaving the place very seriously damaged and with many casualties. This example is one of many where our help and prayers are badly needed. Please remember all Christians in the Middle East in your prayers for peace in God's world.

Poem of the Week

Charles Kingsley, Church of England priest, Regius Professor of modern history at Cambridge, novelist, poet and social reformer, was born in 1819 in Devon. After his studies at Cambridge and then ordination, he became Rector of Eversley in Hampshire, Canon of Chester Cathedral and then Canon of Westminster Abbey. He was appointed personal chaplain to Queen Victoria in 1859, and became private tutor to her eldest son, the Prince of Wales. He was a friend of Charles Darwin and sympathetic to the idea of evolution, being one of the first to welcome the publication of Darwin's *On the Origin of Species*. He is remembered for his poetry, hymns, books for children and particularly as an advocate of Christian Socialism, adult education, and sanitary reform. Whilst there are those who find his poetry somewhat sentimental and typically Victorian, his deep faith and love of nature sing out in his poems. The themes of rebirth and renewal in *Easter Week* are particularly relevant to the Easter season.

See the land, her Easter keeping
Rises as her Maker rose.
Seeds, so long in darkness sleeping.
Burst at last from winter snows.
Earth with heaven above rejoices;
Fields and gardens hail the sprig;
Shaughs and woodlands ring with voices,

Discover music by the giants of the classical era: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Franz Joseph Haydn.

The programme offers two highly contrasting Mass settings.

Mozart's Missa Pastoralis (Pastoral Mass), written in 1770, was very popular in his own lifetime. Although composed when he was a teenager, the exuberance, joy and humour that characterised his later Mass settings was already clearly evident. Haydn's (so called) Nelson Mass could not be more different. Composed in 1798, the original title, Missa in Angustiis - Mass in time of Distress, is a relatable performance relevant to the present day.
