29th June 2025: The Second Sunday after Trinity We will be celebrating our Patronal Festival at 11am. Drinks and light refreshments will be served after the service

6th July 2025: The Third Sunday after Trinity Choral Matins at 11am, with coffee after church.

13th July 2025: The Fourth Sunday after Trinity. Holy Communion at 11am and the last service before the summer break. This will be followed by a Bring and Share Lunch which (weather permitting) will take place on long benches outside 1 Tower Green. (Should it be wet, lunch will take place indoors.) Wine and soft drinks will be provided by the chapel. Do come along!

Prayer of the week

Sir Francis Drake (1540 –1596) was a great British explorer, Elizabethan hero, pirate and slave trader, perhaps best known as the first Englishman to circumnavigate the globe in a single expedition between 1577 and 1580. He was second-in-command of the English fleet during the battle against the Spanish Armada in 1588. Although he was a Member of Parliament at different times for two constituencies in Cornwall and one in Devon, he was at heart essentially a seaman. He was known in Spain as '*El Draque*' ('The Dragon') and much hated for his piracy and for the numerous raids he made against Spanish ships and settlements on his voyages. He died of dysentery in 1596 during a sea voyage to Panama and was buried at sea.

Drake was a staunch Protestant and strongly anti-Catholic, which shaped his worldview and actions throughout his life. He grew up in a family which had faced persecution under Mary Tudor for its religious beliefs, thus solidifying his own Protestant convictions. This religious stance influenced his later career as a privateer and naval officer, particularly in his conflicts with Spain, a major Catholic power. Throughout his life Drake wrote a number of prayers and took religious observance very seriously on board his ships. The prayer below was used by Drake at the start of any voyage or expedition and is included among the prayers at the back of our own chapel order of service.

Prayer of Sir Francis Drake, 1540-1596

O Lord, when thou givest to thy servants to endeavour

in any great matter, grant us to know that it is not

the beginning, but the continuing of the same unto the end, until it be

thoroughly finished, which yieldeth the true glory; through

him who for the finishing of thy work, laid down his life; our redeemer Jesus

Christ. Amen.

<u>Music</u>

May 18 - O praise the great and glorious Lord O praise the great and glorious Lord - Tune by Thomas Tallis.

This great Eastertide hymn is sung here to a melody of Thomas Tallis, which you may recognise as the tune in Ralph Vaughan Williams' Fantasia on a Theme of Thomas Tallis. The melody was written by Tallis in 1567 as a contribution to Archbishop Parker's *The Whole Psalter*, a 16th century metred translation of the entire Psalter.

It is a wonderful melody, constantly changing rhythms (don't try tapping your foot to it!), with the modal harmonic language bringing an expressive solemnity to the text.

O praise our great and glorious Lord, and call upon his name; to strains of joy tune every chord, his mighty acts proclaim; tell how he freed his chosen race from Pharaoh's heavy hand; and led them by his sovereign grace to seek the promised land.

We too have manna from above, the bread that came from heaven; and he who brought salvation nigh has living water given; A rock is ours, from whence the spring in rich abundance flows; and Christ, that rock, our priest, and King, both life and health bestows.

Come let us praise this heavenly food, and trust our heavenly guide; so shall we find death's fearful flood serene as Jordan's tide, so safely reach th'eternal shore, no more by ills opprest, where saints their Lord and God adore, and in his glory, rest.

and following the link which then pops up. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please tick the relevant box and provide the required details on the CAF Bank online form. These two links are also available on our website <u>here</u>.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a oneoff donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
