At last, the Chapel will be open again for three important weeks. Please do come and join us but do be aware that entry into the chapel will be through the vestry and not through the normal West door. 29th June 2025: The Second Sunday after Trinity

0915 Said Holy Communion in the White Tower.

We will celebrate our Patronal Festival in St Peter ad Vincula at 1100 with Sung Holy Communion.

Drinks and light refreshments will be served after the service.

6th July 2025: The Third Sunday after Trinity

0915 Said Holy Communion in the White Tower.

Choral Matins at 1100 in St Peter ad Vincula, with coffee after church.

13th July 2025: The Fourth Sunday after Trinity.

0915 Said Holy Communion in St Peter ad Vincula.

1100 Sung Holy Communion in St Peter ad Vincula - the last service before the summer break.

This will be followed by a Bring and Share Lunch which (weather permitting) will take place on long benches outside 1 Tower Green. (Should it be wet, lunch will take place indoors.) Wine and soft drinks will be provided by the chapel. Do come along and bring something to share!

Collect for St Peter in Chains

O God, who didst loose the blessed apostle
Peter from his bonds and didst send
him forth unharmed: loose, we pray Thee,
the chains of our sins, and in Thy great mercy
keep us from all evil. Through Jesus
Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Hymn and music to ‘For all the saints, who from their labours rest’.

As next Sunday we shall be celebrating our patron St Peter I thought it might be nice to reflect upon the hymn ‘For all the saints, who from their labours rest’. This popular and well-loved hymn was written by William Walsham How, who later became Bishop of Wakefield. It was written first as a processional hymn but today is sung either as a processional hymn or as a hymn of affirmation of the resurrection and the fulfilment of the Christian belief in life after death. The words are based on Hebrews chapter 12. Over the years the hymn has been set to a number of different tunes but we, like many other people, sing it to the tune *Sine Nomine* by Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1968) who set the words to music in 1904.

Although the hymn, in its original form, had ten verses we normally just sing eight, though I have included nine here. Each verse, step by step, affirms the Christian journey with words of bold reassurance. It’s a favourite of many church-going people, and I’m one of them.

For all the saints, who from their labours rest,
Who Thee by faith before the world confessed,
Thy Name, O Jesu, be forever blessed.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

Thou wast their Rock, their Fortress and their Might;
Thou, Lord, their Captain in the well fought fight;
Thou, in the darkness drear, their one true Light.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

O may Thy soldiers, faithful, true and bold,
Fight as the saints who nobly fought of old,
And win with them the victor’s crown of gold.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

For the Evangelists, by whose blest word,
Like fourfold streams, the garden of the Lord,
Is fair and fruitful, be Thy Name adored.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

O blest communion, fellowship divine!
We feebly struggle, they in glory shine;
Yet all are one in Thee, for all are Thine.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

And when the strife is fierce, the warfare long,
Steals on the ear the distant triumph song,
And hearts are brave, again, and arms are strong.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

The golden evening brightens in the west;
Soon, soon to faithful warriors comes their rest;
Sweet is the calm of paradise the blessed.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

But lo! there breaks a yet more glorious day;
The saints triumphant rise in bright array;
The King of glory passes on His way.
Alleluia, Alleluia!

From earth's wide bounds, from ocean's farthest coast,
Through gates of pearl streams in the countless host,
Singing to Father, Son and Holy Ghost:
Alleluia, Alleluia!

Ave Verum - Gabriel Rheinberger (1839-1901)

Gabriel Rheinberger was one of the most important German composers of church music in the 19th century. His style combines classical structures with a lush harmonic palette creating rich romantic textures.

The music for this arrangement of *Ave Verum* was originally published by Rheinberger as *Nachtgesang* (Night Song), Op. 80, No. 5, and is a setting of a German poem by Robert Reinick, found in his collection *Liebesgarten* (Garden of Love). Douglas Walczak has reimagined this secular song by changing the text to that of the ancient Eucharistic hymn, *Ave Verum*. In the musical world this is called a 'contrafactum' - the substitution of one text for another while retaining the original melody - and is a technique that was especially prevalent in the 16th century. Rheinberger's original melody and harmony provide a fitting vehicle for this heartfelt text expressing some of the core tenets of Christianity.

Ave, verum corpus natum
de Maria Virgine:
vere passum, immolatum
in cruce pro homine:
cuius latus perforatum
fluxit aqua et sanguine:
esto nobis praegustatum,
in mortis examine.
O dulcis, o pie,
O Jesu Fili Mariae.
In nobis, miserere mei nobis. Amen.

*Hail the true body, born
of the Virgin Mary:
You who truly suffered and were sacrificed
on the cross for the sake of man.
From whose pierced flank
flowed water and blood:
Be a foretaste for us
in the trial of death.
O sweet, O merciful,
O Jesus, Son of Mary.
Have mercy on me. Amen.*
