Prayer of the week

The prayer below was written by John Donne in 1628. It's a prayer well known to clergy and is often used at funerals and on other special occasions. Donne, who later became Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, was a man of many different characteristics. In her biography of Donne, entitled *Super-Infinite*, Katherine Rundell describes him as 'deeply flawed' but writes that God nevertheless used him, as he used so many others in the Old Testament who were similarly flawed. Examples of these include Abraham, who lied about his wife, Moses, a reluctant and hot-tempered leader, David, who committed adultery and Jonah who ran from God's call.

I like the way Donne uses *us* and not *me* in this prayer; in other words, we are not alone in our journey of faith. The prayer also connects with the here and now and with our future in heaven. It was written by a man who was aware of his many failings but who loved the God who touched his soul, spoke through him, and inspired him to write this prayer, which we can use at any time.

Bring us, O Lord God, at our last awakening, into the house and gate of Heaven, to enter into that gate and dwell in that house, where there shall be no darkness nor dazzling, but one equal light; no noise nor silence, but one equal music; no fears or hopes, but one equal possession; no ends or beginnings, but one equal eternity, in the habitations of thy glory and dominion, world without end. Amen.


Our Congregation

and following the link which then pops up. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please tick the relevant box and provide the required details on the CAF Bank online form. These two links are also available on our website **here**.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a one-off donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
