Dear friends,

Just as last week's Newsletter was going out, we started to get reports of the dreadful events at the synagogue in Manchester. We stand with our Jewish brothers and sisters in mourning the innocent people who died, those who were injured and those who remain traumatised by the attack, both in Manchester and in the wider Jewish community. Whilst we also stand alongside our Palestinian brothers and sisters who have suffered over the past two years, we especially echo those in both communities who reject violence as a solution to their differences.

Friday then brought the momentous news for us of the appointment of our own Bishop of London and Dean of the Chapels Royal to be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. Commentators have rightly referred to her great pastoral gifts; her caring presence will be greatly missed by all at the Chapels Royal and in the Diocese of London. The service known as the Confirmation of Election will be held in St Paul's Cathedral in January, after which she will legally exercise her ministry as Archbishop. In March she will be enthroned in Canterbury Cathedral. I know that you will join me in sending her and Eamonn our best wishes for this next stage in their lives. The Dean of St Paul's has provided the following prayer:

Heavenly Father, shepherd of your Church, in Bishop Sarah, you have sent us a faithful pastor to lead with wisdom, courage, and love, proclaiming your Gospel, celebrating the sacraments, and guiding your people in unity and truth. Strengthen your Church, we pray, and direct us in your ways; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

I am sure that we all endorse those sentiments.

The Clink Restaurant at Brixton Prison.

The aim of the restaurant is to teach them appropriate skills, so that they can acquire basic qualifications in food preparation and catering to help them find employment after their release. Here is a short poem by Emily Brontë, in which she rejoices in the end of summer and the prospect of winter. Although she does not make it explicit, her words suggest that she is deliberately countering the usual laments which accompany the arrival of autumn. Perhaps knowing that she is going against the grain, she positively welcomes the current signs of decay ("fall, leaves, fall") and actively looks forward to the time when winter robs her of flowers ("I shall smile when wreaths of snow blossom where the rose should grow"). What seems certain is that the dark days are not going to get her down: she is going to find the positive, however dreary the prospect outside. Clearly someone for whom the glass is half full, not half empty.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.
