

The Chapels Royal of St Peter ad Vincula and St John the Evangelist HM Tower of London

Dear friends,

Today, October 13th, as I begin this Newsletter, is the day that the church remembers **Edward the Confessor.** At Westminster Abbey, services will take place, and many people will make a pilgrimage to his shrine. He is an important part of our national heritage, so what do we know about him?



Edward was born in 1002, the son of the English King Ethelred and his Norman wife Emma. Living in exile during the Danish rule, he was invited back to England in 1042 to become king and was heartily welcomed as a descendant of the old royal line. Sustained by Edward's diplomacy and determination, his reign was a balancing act between the influences of stronger characters both at home and abroad. His reputation for sanctity was built on his personal qualities, rather than on political issues. He was concerned to maintain peace and justice in his realm, to avoid foreign wars, and to put his faith into practice. He was generous to the poor, hospitable to strangers, but was no mere religious fanatic. Having vowed as a young man to go on pilgrimage to Rome should his family fortunes ever be restored, he later felt it irresponsible to leave his kingdom, and was permitted instead to found and endow a monastery dedicated

to Saint Peter. Edward chose the abbey on Thorney Island, by the river Thames, thus beginning the royal patronage of Westminster Abbey. He died on January 5^{th} , 1066, and his remains were translated to the Abbey on this day in the year 1162.



Prayer of the week

Bishop John Fisher was an English Catholic prelate who served as Bishop of Rochester between 1504 - 1535 and was Chancellor of Cambridge University. He was executed here at the Tower of London on 22 June 1535, aged 66, and is buried alongside St Thomas More in the crypt of St Peter ad Vincula. He was canonised by Pope Pius X1 on 19th May 1935. He was always thought of as a holy man who cared for his clergy, and by the standards of the day, he lived humbly and without great pomp and ceremony. Bishop John wrote several prayers, many of which are still used in the church today. Perhaps his most famous prayer, which I have chosen for this week, was written when he knew he was to be put to death. It is a prayer asking for courage: whatever the circumstances we find ourselves in, we can always turn to God in our hour of need.

Prayer of St John Fisher

Pray for me, that I may be as courageous in my love of God as you were, even to the point of death if necessary. All the Saints, pray for me! In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.


