This week's Newsletter is very much a reflection about Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day. We, along with the nation, were blessed with good weather, and the sun shone at exactly the right moment on Sunday. This year marked the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) day on May 8 and Victory over Japan (VJ) Day on the 15 August, together marking the end of the Second World War. I was delighted that approximately 400 people joined us in our Act of Remembrance on Tower Green. At the point of the two-minute silence, the whole Tower of London fell quiet and there was a palpable moment of shared understanding between us all. For me, apart from the two-minute silence, the repetition of those words 'We will remember them' echoing around the world is the essence of the ceremony. It is then that I feel we give full honour to the memory of those who gave their lives in the service of their country.

Poem of the week

Last week Cortland chose two moving poems as we prepared for this time of Remembrance. Today, as I write this Newsletter, is Armistice Day and so I thought it appropriate to select a poem associated with the First World War, as we remember those who made the final sacrifice. Rudyard Kipling, whose poem *Gethsemane* I have chosen, was an English journalist, novelist, poet and short story writer. He was born in British India and this inspired much of his writing. Kipling's only son, John, was killed at the battle of Loos in 1915 at the age of 18. He had originally wanted to join the Navy but due to very poor eyesight was turned down. Through his father's connection with Lord Roberts, John enlisted into the Irish Guards. Kipling was deeply affected by his son's death and many of his poems reflect that profound sorrow. *Gethsemane* describes a soldier reflecting on his inevitable death from gas, with Kipling creating a clear parallel with Christ praying about his coming death in the garden of Gethsemane.

The Garden called Gethsemane
In Picardy it was,
And there the people came to see
The English soldiers pass.
We used to pass - we used to pass
Or halt, as it might be,
And ship our masks in case of gas
Beyond Gethsemane.

The Garden called Gethsemane,
It held a pretty lass,
But all the time she talked to me
I prayed my cup might pass.
The officer sat on the chair,
The men lay on the grass,
And all the time we halted there
I prayed my cup might pass.

It didn't pass - it didn't pass It didn't pass from me. I drank it when we met the gas Beyond Gethsemane!



ONE-OFF DONATION. You can make a one-off donation online by clicking on <u>this link</u> or pointing the camera of your phone or tablet at this QR Code

and following the link which then pops up. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please tick the relevant box and provide the required details on the CAF Bank online form. These two links are also available on our website **here**.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a one-off donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
