

The Chapels Royal of St Peter ad Vincula and St John the Evangelist HM Tower of London

Dear friends,



Next Sunday 30th November is Advent Sunday. I always enjoy learning about the practices of other Christian churches and reflecting on what lies behind them. As we had an Orthodox icon of Christ the King last week, I thought we might have one for Advent this week. The conventionally abbreviated Greek words at the top mean 'Mother of God' and those below, alongside the image of Jesus in his mother's womb, mean 'Jesus Christ'.

Western Christians tend to associate fasting with Lent rather than Advent but the Orthodox also fast during Advent. In fact, Orthodox Christians fast for more than half the year, often giving up meat, dairy, eggs and, on strict fast days, giving up oil, wine and fish. By following the prescribed fast of the Church, they are working on their self-control, in the hope that by abstaining from foods, they learn also to abstain from sinning.

The Book of Common Prayer contains a prayer by the Eastern Saint John Chrysostom - John 'Goldenmouth' - (347-407 AD), which we always use at Morning Prayer:

Almighty God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplications unto thee; and dost promise, that when two or three are gathered together in thy Name thou wilt grant their requests; Fulfil now, O Lord, the desires and petitions of thy servants, as may be most expedient for them; granting us in this world knowledge of thy truth, and in the world to come life everlasting.

St John Chrysostom also gave guidance on fasting. In order for fasting to be effective, he said, it must consist not merely of abstention from certain food and drink; rather, those who fast must do so:

" ... with the eye and the ear and the feet and the hands and all the members of our bodies.

Let the hands fast, by being free of avarice.

Let the feet fast, by ceasing to run after sin.

Let the eyes fast, by disciplining them not to glare at that which is sinful.

Let the ear fast, by not listening to evil talk and gossip.

Let the mouth fast from foul words and unjust criticism.

For what good is it if we abstain from birds and fishes, but bite and devour our brothers?"

So, if by any chance you feel like fasting this Advent, there is some helpful advice. I, for one, will look differently in future on chocolate-filled Advent calendars.

<u>The Advent Wreath</u> On Sunday we shall light the first candle on our Advent wreath. These originated in Germany in 1830; the story goes that Johann Hinrich Wichern (1808-81), a pastor in Germany, built a wreath out of an old cartwheel to help the children in his mission school count the days until Christmas. He added small candles to be lit every weekday and Saturday during Advent, and on Sundays, a large white candle was lit. The practice spread and now almost all denominations have adopted it.
