With an eye on St Valentine's Day this Sunday, this week's choice is **Salut d'Amour** by Edward Elgar. Initially titled 'Liebesgruss' (Love's Greeting) Elgar composed it as an engagement present for his fiancée Caroline Alice Roberts. Dedicated to 'Carice', a contraction of Caroline and Alice, Carice was also the name given to Edward and Caroline's daughter. Caroline was fluent in German - hence the first title - but after slow sales Elgar's publishers changed the name of the work in the hope of broadening its appeal. It was a clever move as the simple charm and elegance of this lovely miniature has made it one of the composer's most popular and widely arranged works. Here it is performed by violin and piano, as was originally intended by Elgar.
