Laura has chosen this poem for you this week. Elizabeth Bishop (1911-1979) was an American poet and short story writer. She was Poet Laureate of the US from 1949-50, won the Pulitzer Prize in 1956 and is considered one of the most important and distinguished American poets of the 20th century. This poem is in sonnet form and was written in 1928. It describes the desire the writer has to be held, healed, calmed and lulled to sleep by the music she loves.

I am in need of music that would flow
Over my fretful, feeling fingertips,
Over my bitter-tainted, trembling lips,
With melody, deep, clear, and liquid-slow.
Oh, for the healing swaying, old and low,
Of some song sung to rest the tired dead,
A song to fall like water on my head,
And over quivering limbs, dream flushed to glow!

There is a magic made by melody:
A spell of rest, and quiet breath, and cool
Heart, that sinks through fading colours deep
To the subaqueous stillness of the sea,
And floats forever in a moon-green pool,
Held in the arms of rhythm and of sleep.
