As many of you will know, I was away last week in Jerusalem. I stayed at St George's Cathedral Hostel, which is just ten minutes' walk from the Damascus Gate. Whilst this wasn't a tourist trip, I did visit some of the key holy sites, for example, the Holy Sepulchre and the Mount of Olives, and I also walked the Via Dolorosa.

Most interesting to me was meeting and talking to Palestinian Christians, trying to understand why several Christian centres have been closed, and then visiting the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital, which is the only charitable provider of expert eye care in the West Bank, Gaza and East Jerusalem. It was also important to try and find time to savour the

experience of being in one of the oldest cities in the world and a place of complex political and religious differences. It was extremely hot but I did manage to walk everywhere.



This Chapel Royal feels a special link with the Order of St John because their Lord Prior from 2008 to 2014 - the most senior position in the Order below royalty - was Professor Tony Mellows. Tony Mellows worshipped at the Tower for forty years. We are delighted that Elizabeth Mellows, who read our first lesson on 19<sup>th</sup> June, maintains that tradition of involvement with these Chapels – and, indeed, with the Order of St John.
