Dear Friends,

A lot is happening at the moment in the life of the chapel. Attached are pictures of the Lilies and Roses Service, which commemorates King Henry VI who was murdered in the Wakefield Tower on the 21st May 1471. Last Sunday we had The Rt. Rev. Rob Gillion with us, preaching at Choral Matins and baptising Penelope after the service. Thursday 26th May is Ascension Day, and at 6pm there will be a service of Choral Evensong followed by the Beating of the Bounds.

Please note that this coming Sunday, 29th May, (The Sunday after Ascension) there is the RideLondon 2022 event. This will mean the closing of roads around The Tower from 4am until 7.30pm, and there will be many more roads closed than for the London Marathon.

For Central London, the following roads will be closed: Upper Thames Street, Lower Thames Street, Byward Street, Tower Bridge, Tower Hill, East Smithfield, The Highway, Limehouse Link Tunnel, Aspen Way, East India Dock Tunnel & other roads in surrounding areas.

Poem of the week

Phillis Wheatley, the first known African-American woman poet, was born in West Africa in 1753 and sold into slavery at the age of seven. She was transported to North America, where she was bought and subsequently educated by a wealthy Boston family, the Wheatleys, who gave her their name. She was reading Greek and Latin classics by the time she was 12 and began writing poetry at the age of 14. In 1773, Phillis came to England with a member of the Wheatley family and was welcomed by several dignitaries, including the Earl of Dartmouth and Benjamin Franklin. It was during her time in London that the first volume of her poems was published. Phillis Wheatley became a devout Christian while living with the Wheatleys and in her most famous poem, On Being Brought from Africa to America, she admonishes those who see Christianity as only for white people.

On being brought from Africa to America

‘Twas mercy brought me from my Pagan land,
Taught my benighted soul to understand
That there’s a God, that there’s a Saviour too:
Once I redemption neither sought nor knew.
Some view our sable race with scornful eye,
‘Their colour is a diabolic die’.
Remember, Christians, Negros, black as Cain,
May be refin’d, and join th’angelic train.
